About MSF

Our actions are guided by medical ethics and the principles of impartiality, independence, and neutrality.

What is this leaflet about?

An important part of MSF values is its accountability and transparency. This means we review all our activities to ensure they are done properly and share our findings with patients and partners, whether they highlight strengths or weaknesses. As part of this process, we hired an external panel to evaluate the reconstructive surgery intervention in Gaza before the end of 2022. This contributes to full transparency in the process and help us see how these services can improve.



We are pleased to share with you some of the evaluation findings.

Things that are going well in the project:

- 01 The project activities and design are highly relevant to Gaza population needs
- 02 Project implementation and admission criteria has adapted well to Gaza context. It started with the Great March of Return patient's, then expanded to include children and patient with old trauma injuries.
- 03 The orthoplastic services and the high-quality care at zero costs to the patients offered by MSF are quite unique.
- 04 Patients are satisfied, grateful of the quality level of MSF services.
- 05 MSF staff expressed that their work with MSF helped them to gain more experience and skills, and practice

What can be improved in the next period:

- 01 Increase knowledge exchange between the projects offering reconstructive surgery, like the ones in Amman - Jordan, Mosul - Iraq, and Gaza - Palestine.
- 02 Make a better use of the medical data collected by the services, so that they can be used to conduct research projects and improve the services.
- 03 Intensify MSF awareness in the community level
- 04 Improve the follow up process for patients post discharge
